4. DISCUSSION

The CID name is derived from the area known as Simon's Kloof, which forms part of Simon's Town. The intended area of the Simon's Kloof Community Improvement District ("the CID area") extends from the end of Nelson Way & Horatio Way on the East to the end of Victory Way, Victory Close and Dolphin Way on the West. The North boundary is where Nelson Way and Dolphin Way meet Runciman Drive (but not including Runciman Drive). The Southern boundary is Table Mountain National Park between the East and the West boundaries.

This small and beautiful area, which is primarily residential, is located on the narrow strip of land between Table Mountain National Park and Kalk Bay. The Simon's Kloof area has a small population of approximately 250 compared to 7,000 in Simon's Town, 10,000 in Fish Hoek and 6,000 in Muizenberg.

The community is diverse in terms of its racial, ethnic and religious backgrounds with the wealthier and poorer residents' sharing this beautiful living environment in harmony for generations. The overwhelming view of the community is to preserve the quality of life they share.

The area is not only diverse in respect of the composition of its residents, but also in the range of activities that take place here such as B&B's, holiday homes, walkways and parks, and walking trails in the mountains overlooking the area.

Despite these differences, it is important to note that the community of Simon's Kloof has always treasured and protected its diversity and inclusiveness.

Initiation Phase

An introductory meeting took place on 4 May 2023, between the CID Branch and members of the proposed Simon's Kloof CID Steering Committee. The purpose was to apprise them of the legislative prerequisites and the timeline essential for the establishment process. Subsequently, upon receiving confirmation from the Steering Committee that they accept the CID concept and wishes to pursue CID establishment, a database containing a comprehensive list of all properties was extracted to compile an arrears profile of the area. The arrears profile showcased a collection ratio of 97.5% for the period spanning from 1 May 2022 to 30 April 2023 in respect of the full municipal account.

This arrears profile adheres to the CID Policy clause 7.4.2 guidelines as it reflects the payment trends within the community. If the collection ratio were to fall below 95%, it would signal potential challenges in affording enhanced and supplementary municipal services, potentially undermining the sustainability and efficacy of the CID. Moreover, it would expose the City to cash flow risks, as the City collects the

additional property rates and disburses it in equal monthly instalments based on an approved budget. Hence, a satisfactory collection ratio is crucial, ensuring a solid foundation for the Steering Committee to proceed with the establishment process, done at their own risk.

The favourable collection ratio enabled the Steering Committee to advance with the completion of their Public Participation Plan.

Public Participation Plan

Any application for the determination of a CID must be subjected to a public participation process. As per clause 9 of the CID Policy, the Steering Committee is required to submit and maintain a public participation plan (see annexure A of the Business Plan). The Public Participation Plan, details their approach to engage with the local community and additional ratepayers. This plan provides specifics about the methods of notifications, contents, language and mediums of notices, mechanisms to provide access to documents, consultation methods and venues.

<u>Urban Management Survey</u>

According to clause 8.1.2 of the CID Policy, the Steering Committee conducted an urban management survey to gather insights into the area's status, as perceived by property owners and residents. This survey covered pivotal focus areas under urban management, including public safety, cleansing, environmental development, and social responsibility.

81 respondents completed the survey – resulting in an 80% completion ratio, of which 93% are homeowners. This exceeded the required 20% threshold of additional ratepayers.

68% of respondents expressed satisfaction with the overall public safety in Simon's Kloof, while less than 3% reported feeling unsafe in their homes. Additionally, 25% indicated that their private security significantly contributed to their sense of safety. Regarding the use of public spaces, 61% of respondents felt safe, with 33% specifying feeling safe only during daytime hours. Furthermore, 90% of respondents emphasized the significance of maintaining and improving overall public safety in Simon's Kloof.

Overall, the survey yielded valuable insights and provided a solid foundation for further planning and development for shaping the business plan (see annexure C of the Business Plan for the full urban management survey report).

Business Plan Content

The formulation of the business plan was directed through the results from the urban management survey report as well as the outcome from the engagement with Subcouncil 19, which assessed the City services rendered in the area. Focus groups were also convened with local community members and interested parties to conduct a thorough needs analysis, forming the basis for crafting a comprehensive implementable business plan aimed at enhancing and revitalizing the area.

The Business Plan for the Simon's Kloof CID covering the period from 1 July 2024 to 30 June 2029 comprises of three key components:

- A Motivation Report outlining the necessity and framework for delivering supplementary municipal services (Part A in the Business Plan);
- An Implementation Plan detailing actionable steps to execute the proposed services effectively (Part B in the Business Plan); and
- A Term Budget reflecting the financial resources required to support these services (Part C in the Business Plan).

The full Business Plan is included as annexure A of the report.

The Business Plan underwent a thorough review to ensure compliance with CID legislative requirements, as well as considerations of affordability and sustainability. On 10 November 2023, it was distributed to all relevant Service Departments for their review, aiming to facilitate alignment with the Integrated Development Plan (IDP) and maintaining of service delivery standards.

All the comments received are recorded in annexure B and was sent to the Steering Committee for consideration and further engagement with the Service Departments. A nil response from the other Departments consulted means that the proposed Business Plan is not in conflict with the functions of the respective Departments with whom they will interact should the application be successful The comments provided were carefully considered within their context.

First Public Meeting

The outcome of the urban management survey and draft Business Plan were presented to property owners and stakeholders of Simon's Kloof during the first official public meeting convened on 10 October 2023. This process adhered to the public participation requirements as delineated in the Public Participation Plan.

The meeting garnered substantial attendance and facilitated productive interaction between the Steering Committee and property owners. Documentation including the email notice, presentation materials, and meeting minutes are enclosed for reference (see annexure C).

Public Comments on the Draft Business Plan

Following the public meeting, a 30-day commentary period afforded property owners and stakeholders the opportunity to provide feedback on the draft business plan. The steering committee carefully considered all comments but did not amend the Business Plan. The schedule with comments and the Steering Committee's responses is included as annexure D in the Business Plan.

Second Public Meeting

The second public meeting occurred on 16th November 2023 as per the requirements listed in the Public Participation Plan. The Steering Committee presented the schedule with all the public comments on the Business Plan, as well as the final business plan.

The meeting was well attended and facilitated productive interaction between the Steering Committee and property owners. Documentation including the email notice, presentation materials, and meeting minutes are enclosed for reference (see annexure D). The Consent/Objection Phase started at the conclusion of the second public meeting.

All public meetings were attended by officials from the City Improvement District Branch to deal with technical questions relating to the application.

Consent/Objection Phase

As the proposed Simon's Kloof CID is regarded as a residential CID in terms of the criteria listed in section 5 of the CID By-law, not fewer than 60% written support was needed before an application for establishment could be submitted to the City.

The Steering Committee obtained consent from 101 of the 129 properties (78.3%) within the Simon's Kloof CID as per their submission. The consent is based on "one property = one vote" irrespective of the usage, valuation or size of the property.

A total of 5 objections were received (3.9%).

In accordance with clause 10.6 of the CID Policy, the Steering Committee engaged with the objectors to address any misunderstandings and listen to their reasons for objection. While the objective is not to change the objectors' minds, these discussions aim to ensure transparency and consider any valuable insights that may improve operational outcomes if the application is successful.

Annexure E provides a full list of all properties indicating whether they supported or objected to the application or abstained from the process.

A summary of the Steering Committee's engagement with objectors, along with copies of all objections and email correspondence between the Steering Committee and the objectors, are included in annexure F.

Application

As per clause 11.3 of the CID Policy, the administrative deadline for submitting an application is set for 31 October, with the possibility of an extension upon receipt of a properly motivated request. Due to delays in the availability of the new General Valuation (2022) data prior to the implementation date, all Steering Committees were granted an extension of their submission date to 31 January 2024.

The Steering Committee duly submitted the application to establish the Simon's Kloof CID, as evidenced by the application letter dated 18 December 2023 (attached as annexure G). The submission includes the following documents:

- The final Business Plan (included as annexure A in the report);
- Written consent or objection forms of property owners within the proposed CID who will be liable for paying the additional rate (all consent forms are available at the CID Branch office on request subject to POPIA);
- The property database indicating consent or objection to the CID proposal per property (included as annexure E in the report); and
- Notices of the public meetings (included with annexures C and D in the report).

The application was verified by the CID Branch and found to be a valid application.

Notification of the application

The Steering Committee notified property owners of the valid application and where it could be inspected, by email, a published notice on the Simon's Kloof CID website and posted announcements on the community notice board and WhatsApp group (refer annexure H).

To ensure widespread awareness of the application, the City's Revenue Department emailed a notice to all property owners who are registered for e-Billing and included a message on the municipal accounts of property owners receiving their statements via traditional mail.

Decision

According to the Urban Management Survey, Simon's Kloof is a well-maintained area, albeit facing ongoing challenges such as vagrancy and rising crime levels, leading to a decline in the area's condition. Thus, efforts are needed to restore it to its former well-maintained state.

The applicant has diligently followed all legislative procedures and garnered no less than 60% support from property owners, as mandated by the CID By-law for a residential city improvement district.

To fund the Simon's Kloof CID's first year budget of R 380 303, the CID additional rate is calculated based on the total municipal valuation of properties within the CID area. The approval of the additional rate will be considered by Council as part of the

City's 2024-25 Budget and is slated for implementation starting from 1 July 2024, pending approval of the application.

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A. MOTIVATION REPORT

Introduction:

1. Outlining the nature and function of the CID

It is proposed that a City Improvement District (CID) be established covering the area of Simon's Kloof, in the Southern Peninsula of Cape Town, within the City of Cape Town (The City). A CID is a community-driven venture, allowing the local community, property owners and local businesses to organise and fund improvements of specific areas within the City. Once established by the City, a non-profit company (the "CID Company"), carries out the improvements and upgrades proposed in its business plan, funded by an additional rate levied on rateable property located within the CID. In the case of the proposed CID, it is envisaged that both commercial and residential property owners will contribute to the improvements and upgrades.

2. Name of the City Improvement District:

Simon's Kloof Community Improvement District: (SKCID).

The name is derived from the fact that the proposed CID area lies in the area known as Simon's Kloof, being part of Simon's Town. The intended area of the Simon's Kloof Community Improvement District ("the CID area") extends from end of Nelson Way & Horatio Way on the East to End of Victory Way, Victory Close & Dolphin Way on the West. North boundary is where Nelson Way & Dolphin Way meet Runciman Drive (but not including Runciman Drive). Southern boundary is Table Mountain National Park between East & West boundaries.

This small and beautiful area, which is primarily residential, is located on the narrow strip of land between Table Mountain National Park and Kalk Bay. The Simon's Kloof area has a small population of approximately 250 compared to approximately 7,000 in Simon's Town, 10,000 in Fish Hoek and 6,000 in Muizenberg.

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Our community is diverse in terms of its racial, ethnic and religious backgrounds and the fact that wealthier and poorer residents have

shared this beautiful living environment in harmony for generations. This diversity contributes greatly to the special character of our

Finally, it should be mentioned that the physical beauty of our location and the village charm of our modest built environment has

always attracted many visitors. These range from visitors from other areas of Cape Town and South Africa to an increasing number

of visitors from around the world. The tourist popularity of our village is increasing steadily. This has led to a marked increase in the

number of businesses that cater for these visitors, including restaurants, guesthouses and retail shops. These visitors and the

businesses that cater to them are also important stakeholders in our community and their interests should be taken account of.

This overview of our community forms an important context for the framing and understanding of this CID Business Plan proposal.

4. Geographical area of the proposed CID, including a diagram depicting the street boundaries.

The intended area of the Simon's Kloof Community Improvement District ("the CID area") extends from end of Nelson Way & Horatio Way on the East to End of Victory Way, Victory Close & Dolphin Way on the West. North boundary is where Nelson Way & Dolphin Way meet Runciman Drive (but not including Runciman Drive). Southern boundary is Table Mountain National Park between East & West boundaries.

Boundaries of the SKCID:

The boundaries of the proposed SKCID are shown on the plan below and are:

Eastern Boundary: End of Nelson Way & Horatio Way. ERF numbers 3141,3454, 3455 & 3473.

Northern Boundary: Is where Nelson Way & Dolphin Way meet Runciman Drive (but not including Runciman Drive).

Western Boundary: End of Victory Way, Victory Close & Dolphin Way on the West. ERF numbers 4006, 4002, 4496, 4900 & 4498.

Southern Boundary: Is Table Mountain National Park between East & West boundaries as above.





5. Strategic Objectives

Vision

To maintain a safe, clean, and pleasant area that is a highly sought-after place to live, visit and do business in because of its social harmony and its integration with its natural surroundings and modest built environment. It is our vision to establish Simon's Kloof as one of the most sought-after areas in the southern suburbs.

Mission

The SKCID mission is to ensure:

Continuous sustainable improvements to the public safety of its residents and visitors, such that the SK community can enjoy a safe and clean environment, while the area retains its peaceful, residential, family friendly, close to nature and cultural character.

Residents and visitors continue to respect the natural and built environment by keeping it safe and clean and encourage indigenous biodiversity. Community spirit is encouraged through regular communication.

Goals and Objectives

Within the context of developing a close and mutually beneficial working relationship with the City, its local Councillors and other stakeholders, the broad goals and objectives are:

5.1 Improve Public Safety:

- To reduce crime and damage to residents and owner's properties
- To monitor performance of the contracted Public Safety services provider
- To establish and maintain a good relationship with our local SAPS in Simon's Town
- Drive Community safety initiatives: investigate and supplement initiatives to promote community safety and monitor effectiveness of any / all such initiatives.

5.2 Maintenance, Litter and Cleanliness of Public Spaces:

- To provide enhanced services to the community that will result in a safe, clean, pleasant, attractive and well-managed area thereby improving the learning, living, working and overall experience in Simon's Kloof.
- To improve the maintenance and upgrading of public spaces

5.3 Urban Management, including but not limited to beautifying and upgrading public areas and facilities and ensuring additional fire management measures and safeguards;

- To ensure maintenance of verges in SK streets
- · To encourage continued and improved recycling within the neighbourhood
- To ensure maintenance of verges in SK streets and removal of alien vegetation
- To provide supplementary firefighting equipment and communicate locations thereof.
- To ensure maintenance and working status of such firefighting equipment
- To train the community in conjunction with local firefighting unit on the use of such equipment
- To protect property values

6. Core values

The core values of the CID are transparency, accountability and community participation. To be achieved through:

- Transparent governance and effective communication;
 - Ongoing communication to and with the SKCID community
 - The submission of annual reports to the local community
 - The encouragement of local community participation in Board meetings and members' meetings of the CID company
 - The publication of relevant documentation online
- Community support and encouragement for involvement in;
 - Community safety forums

- Various community upliftment projects, e.g., clean-ups, greening, recycling, landscaping, public space upgrading
- Ward forums and civic associations
- Support of local schools
- Support of local NGOs and humanitarian organisations.

Proposed Services and/or Projects

7. Why Simon's Kloof needs a CID

The Urban Management Survey (UMS) / Perception Survey highlighted concerns within the community with regards to safety and crime, speeding on main access route, environment/urban management and cleanliness. These issues are not being adequately dealt with by the City and local policing, and it is felt that a CID will make a significant positive contribution towards addressing the current concerns.

8. Recent feedback from residents

Crime and social problems such as drug use have increased in the area over the past number of years. Also, problems have been experienced in the maintenance of public infrastructure and amenities.

Various ongoing community initiatives attempt to address these problems. For example, Surveillance Cameras & NPR Camera, Dedicated Security Vehicles, local Crime Watch attempts to monitor and control crime in the area in conjunction with ISS Security, MACH1 Security & SAPS. Upkeep and ongoing maintenance of common areas with Simon's Kloof, Fire Protection activities in line with SA Fire Department.

However, the continued fund drives to achieve the required funds to pursue these initiatives are very limited and hence their effectiveness is also limited. Consequently, a proposal to pursue the possibility of establishing a City Improvement District (CID) was made at the SKNW General Meeting in January 2023. This proposal was informally accepted by the meeting and consequently a Steering Committee from the Simon's Kloof Neighbourhood Watch committee was established to pursue the proposal.

The Steering Committee wishes to pursue the establishment of a CID as a viable basis to address these problems on a sustainable basis to prevent urban decay and a further increase of crime and social problems in the area. Accordingly, a perception survey was conducted in Simon's Kloof to identify the needs and concerns of residents and businesses in the area. A copy of the perception survey report titled Simon's Kloof Community Improvement District Perception Survey, dated Monday, August 7, 2023 is included on the CID website www.simonskloofcid.co.za

81 respondents completed the full perception survey, which was an 80% response rate of resident/property owners of the COCT database that was used for the survey.

Key Outcomes:

Although an overwhelming majority of recipients rated the Simon's Kloof attributes of clean, safe, welcoming and attractive - positively (all >90%), 86% of respondents are somewhat dissatisfied with municipal service delivery; with only 10% are completely satisfied.

Outcomes of the survey in respect of specific issues include:

- Safety and security: 68% rated the level of safety and security as Excellent/Very Good and 32% as Good/Fair, thus indicating a level of satisfaction with the level of safety and security in the area. Moreover, only 5% of respondents indicated that they or someone close to them had been a victim of crime in the area in the last 2 years. In respect of the effectiveness of current policing efforts, 77% agreed that current efforts by SAPS in particular were ineffective.
- Over 88% of recipients (Top 2 Box) held an overall perception that the cleanliness and neatness of SK was good or excellent.
- However, 48% of respondents indicated that litter on pavements and public spaces is a problem, most respondents regard the general state of cleanliness as good.
- Maintenance of public spaces, including pavements and steps: a significant 66% of respondents regard as Excellent/Good however improvement is still necessary to the overall quality of these important community assets. Similarly, overall, 56% of recipients (Top 2 Box) rate the maintenance of storm water drains and street gutters as Excellent/Good, with improvement still necessary.
- 80% of recipients would like to see an improvement in speed management on Runciman Drive which is the only road access to Simon's Kloof and is of concern to residents.

• Social issues: 31% of respondents perceive homelessness to be a problem particularly in Simon's Kloof. Respondents also identified a range of associated social issues that require attention, including loitering, begging and drug abuse.

Respondents were asked if they would be prepared to pay a top-up levy on their rates bill for enhanced municipal services and public security in the area. Overall, 80% of recipients who answered this question are prepared to pay an additional rate. Some participants indicated that they would be prepared to pay additional monthly amounts but feel the contribution calculated against individual property valuations may not be the fairest system.

It is however important to take note of many of the general comments of respondents where their willingness to pay is qualified by the feeling that local authorities and government services should be improved in the area irrespective of the formation of the CID.

Although there were differences in emphasis between respondents, the community clearly indicated that the most important issues are:

- 1. Safety and security
- 2. Litter and cleanliness
- 3. Maintenance of public spaces

9. Brief outline of proposed services and projects

There are four (3) main focus areas.

- a. **Public Safety Initiatives** the intention is to maintain and supplement the comprehensive CCTV system linked to a tactical response service comprising vehicles and public safety officers.
- b. Cleansing & Environmental Initiatives the CID management will appoint service providers to provide and supervise the labour needed to supplement the service provided by the City.
- d. **Urban Management Initiatives -** the CID will work with the City in order to monitor, record and follow up on community infrastructure maintenance issues that need attention. This will include firefighting initiatives and the speed prevention / management issues required on our access road.

Public Safety Initiatives

10. Proposed services and projects

There are currently 28 actively monitored cameras in the area which have provided positive results in crime monitoring and reduction. These 28 cameras are the property of the SKNW and will be donated to the SKCID. The CID proposal makes provision for the installation of additional cameras to monitor potential weak spots on boundaries and will be phased in over the next 5 years. Residents with appropriate camera systems on their boundaries will be encouraged where possible to link these to the CCTV monitoring system.

These CCTV Cameras will be monitored 12/7 and linked to a tactical response service with the Licence Plate Recognition (LPR) monitored 24x7 by specialist company. The CID will contract with the current SKNW service provider who has a tactical response team. When a problem is identified by the control room, the tactical response team will be mobilised and the operations manager and SAPS advised where relevant. The tactical response team operates with a dedicated night patrol vehicle on a 12-hour x 365 days pa basis solely within the advised SKCID boundary.

11. Areas where improvements will be carried out

Weak spots on boundaries will be identified and additional cameras will be placed where deemed necessary.

A survey will be done of current dark spots and areas, residents encouraged to install and activate boundary lighting.

12. Total estimated costs

The projected year 1 annualised cost for the public safety support service plus the CCTV cameras will be R100,545

The cost of the proposed public safety support over the initial five-year term of the proposed CID will be as summarised below

13. Allocation of resources

The thrust of the public safety initiative will be to sustain and enhance current SKNW initiatives which have created an environment that criminals feel uncomfortable in. The SKCID will provide up to 4 new cameras linked with the 28 existing active cameras (to be donated by the SKNW as the cameras have been paid for by contributions from residents. There will be 12x7 monitoring of cameras; a dedicated tactical response vehicle will also patrol the area uniformly, also operating 12x7 staffed by qualified public safety officers. The results of the UMS indicated that public safety was the major priority, with poor perceived support from local Simon's Town police. As such, the majority of the CID budget has been allocated to providing improved public safety initiatives.

14. Consistency with municipality's Integrated Development Plan and Municipal Property Rates Act

The proposed improvements and/or upgrades are consistent with the municipality's Integrated Development Plan (IDP) (16 objectives linked to its priorities and foundations) and with section 22(4) of the Local Government: Municipal Property Rates Act, No. 6 of 2004 (the "MPRA"). The proposed services and projects will support the City of Cape Town's IDP, Safety – by enhancing the public safety in the area for the benefit of the community and contributing to Objectives 5 (Effective law enforcement to make communities safer) and 6 (Strengthen partnerships for safer communities).

Cleansing and Environmental Initiatives

15. Proposed services / projects

The CID will appoint cleansing companies where required. The UMS survey results highlighted that although cleanliness and litter is a concern, Simon's Kloof was viewed as a generally clean area. Certain hotspots on the boundaries were highlighted and bin pickers and baboons were identified as resulting in increased litter. Programs will be implemented to address the bin pickers and the community will be encouraged to only put bins out on the day of collection and ensure their bins are baboon proofed.

The CID will encourage continued support of the recycling programs already in place and continue to advise of additional recycling drop off areas. Wet waste is encouraged to be dropped off at a local NGO.

Additional cleansing and monthly clean ups will be organised and implemented by the CID with residents to address litter on boundaries. The Public Safety security provider will be tasked to deter bin pickers to alleviate damage to residents refuse bags on refuse collection days. Residents will be encouraged to only put their bins out on the morning of refuse collection, and this will be monitored by the SKCID.

16. Total estimated costs

The projected annualised year 1 cost for Urban Maintenance will be R44,000.

The cost of the Urban Maintenance to be provided over the initial five-year term of the proposed CID will be as summarised below:

17. Allocation of resources

The entire area will benefit uniformly from this allocation of resources.

18. Consistency with municipality's IDP and MPR Act

This additional cleaning fits in with the City's IDP and with section 22(4) of the MPRA in that a small business will be used for this purpose, so it will create employment and give work to an SME. It will also contribute to community satisfaction as the area will be cleaner. This is in line with the Objective 4 of the IDP (Well managed and modernised infrastructure to support economic growth) specifically objective 4.7 promoting cleanliness and addressing illegal dumping. The CID will work with the City where necessary regarding solid waste objective 4.5 (excellence in waste service delivery programme) and 4.6 (waste minimisation and recycling program).

Urban Management Initiatives

19. Proposed services and projects

The SKCID will perform supplemental services such as maintaining common areas and community gardens. This will include the removal of alien vegetation and liaison with the relevant authorities re firebreak management and evaluation of and training re community firefighting equipment. The CID will work closely with the City Service Departments to ensure speedy repairs to roads, pavements and drainage when needed, this will be achieved by reporting any faults via the COCT C3 Service Request Tool (C3) reporting system. The responsibility for carrying out repairs of this nature is the City's and all that SKCID can do here is advise what work needs to be done. Reports on burst water pipes, blocked or damaged storm water drains, potholes, illegal dumping, fading road markings and broken or missing street signs will be logged with the City's C3 system and the SKCID will ensure these issues are resolved adequately or escalate within the City. Other initiatives will include logging C3 reports to refresh road markings; repair damaged signposts; general maintenance (broken window policy); and removing graffiti, stickers and illegal advertising.



20. Areas where improvements will be carried out

There will be ad hoc work carried out in order to improve the existing street landscaping within Simon's Kloof.

A new focus resulting from the UMS/Perception Survey is increased reckless speeding, a corrective measure may include implementation of traffic calming measures on Runciman Drive, which is the sole access to Simon's Kloof. The SKCID will work with the relevant transport authorities and the local Simon's Town Civic Association given this access road feeds and impacts other nearby residential areas. Further to 80% of residents who answered this question in the recent UMS/Perception Survey indicating concern, we will facilitate a petition for impacted residents to call for appropriate improvement and engage with the sub-council in this regard.

21. Total estimated costs

The cost of the projects and services to be invested in over the initial five-year term of the proposed CID will be a summarized below:

22. Allocation of resources

The SKCID area does not have any parks and wherever possible in the SKCID additional area greening (e.g., road verges) will be done as community initiatives. No amount has been budgeted for these initiatives. Maintenance, clearing and removal of alien vegetation in common areas and in SK roads where visibility is impacted has been budgeted for.

23. Consistency with municipality's IDP and the MPR Act

The proposed services and projects are in line with IDP Objective 1.4 (Targeted urban development program) and 1.5 (Consolidated land pipelines and release programme) as well as Objective 15 (A more spatially integrated and inclusive city) of the City's IDP and Section 22 (4) of the MPRA.

Financial Impact of the CID

24. Who will fund the CID?

The CID operates via a statutory non-profit company (NPC) funded by additional property rates (which attract VAT) that are paid by property owners to the City monthly. The additional rates are collected by the City on behalf of the CID.

The City pays the CID one-twelfth $(^{1}/_{12})$ of the CID's approved annual budget on a monthly basis and retains 3% of the monthly payment as a provision for bad debts. The NPC will be managed by the Board, who will have been provided with functional and

financial oversight of the CID approved Business Plan.

Membership of the NPC is open to all registered property owners in the CID area and while it is not obligatory, all property owners are encouraged to apply for membership (at no cost) to exercise their rights to influence the business of the CID. The CID is accountable to its members and annually reports on its management and finances at the Annual General Meeting (which all registered property owners are entitled to attend).

25. How much will it cost?

25.1 How the amount of the additional rate is to be calculated:

The following example can be used to calculate what the likely individual additional rate contributions for residential and non- residential properties, based on current municipal valuations of properties owned, could be

Municipal valuation x R = Annual contribution (VAT excl.) – Note: R represents the approved SKCID additional property rate.

- Annual contribution (VAT excl.) ÷ 12 = Average monthly contribution (VAT excl.)
- Average monthly contribution (VAT excl.) x 1.15 = Average monthly contribution (VAT incl.)

e.g. Residential – R5,000,000 x R0.000613 = R3,065.00 \div 12 = R255.42 x 1.15 = R293.73

Non-Residential – R2,000,000 x R0.000832 = R1,664.00 \div 12 = R138.67 x 1.15 = R159.47

25.2 Possible year-on-year increases in the additional rate during the second to fifth years of the CID term;

25.2.1 Given our current understanding of cost increases (staff costs, rentals, electricity, petrol and other

- operating costs) we have applied a 7,5% increase to costs for years 2 to 5.
- 25.2.2. Subject to unknown factors such as those highlighted in 25.2.1 above, the Budget has been prepared to comply with the maximum additional rates as provided by the City's CID Policy in terms of year-on-year increases in any financial year.

d) Proposed Management Structure

26. Incorporation of a non-profit company

Once the Inaugural Board has approval from the City, the Board will register a non-profit company (NPC). The NPC will open a bank account, register the company for PAYE and VAT, and follow the legal steps outlined in the Implementation Plan.

27. Membership and Board of Directors

- 27.1 Membership of SKCID Company is open to eligible ratepayers in the defined area.
- 27.2 The inaugural Board of Directors (for the first 6 months this will be the Steering Committee) will have the portfolios below. Feedback per portfolio will be given at Board Meetings on the implementation of the Business Plan. Board members will be assigned the roles below, for the initial period of 6 months, during which a members meeting will be held to elect the Board of Directors who will hold office until the next AGM.

27.3 The Board will meet quarterly, and the community may attend the meeting for the first 30 minutes thereof, to inform the board of any issues. All property owners paying the additional property rate may become members after applying to the board and completing the necessary documentation. A political representative will be appointed to the Board as an observer by the

Executive Mayor. Board members will not receive remuneration.

27.4 Financial and Performance Reporting Requirements Provision has been made in the budget for the engagement of a third-party service provider to provide accounting and tax services to the SKCID. The services to be provided will primarily be the maintenance of the books of account and the submission of required returns to the Revenue authorities. Monthly management accounts will be prepared by the appointed service provider for presentation to and approval by the directors of the company before being submitted to the City on the due date. Services as stipulated in the Business Plan will be provided by service providers who will be appointed by the Board of Directors. Comprehensive quotes will be obtained for evaluation, score and decision by the Board. Service provider selection decisions will be recorded in the minutes of the director's meetings.

27.5 The SKCID may employ a CID manager to manage the day-to-day affairs of the CID. No office space will be required for the CID manager as they will work from home or the residence of a committee member.

Permissible Amendments

28. Purpose and scope

If, at any time, it were decided that the geographical boundaries of Simonskloof needed to change, then such change would need to go through a formal process as required in terms of section 26 of the CID By-law.

If additional services are required, stemming from collaboration with City departments, which are not specified in the motivation report but deemed supplementary municipal services, the business plan can be amended without further consent by submitting a request to the City in terms of section 25 of the CID By-law as long as it is not material.

PROPOSED SIMONSKLOOF COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT PERCEPTION SURVEY

Dear Simon's Kloof Property Owner

As a property owner or member of the community in Simon's Kloof, you are no doubt aware of some of the problems in the area. Incidents of crime, grime, homelessness and urban degradation are on the rise. These problems are of concern and need to be effectively addressed. Property owners of other communities have already invested in the future of their areas by establishing their own Special Rating Areas commonly known as City Improvement Districts (CID). Currently 51 CID's successfully operate in the City of Cape Town and with additional 32 CID applications in process.

A Steering Committee was established earlier this year and have undertaken the task to commence investigating the process to establish a CID within Simon's Kloof and as such are appealing for your support.

Part of this process involves the completion of a Perception Survey by residents. The survey aims to obtain your perception of and to identify the local community and ratepayer concerns and identifies municipal services priorities for Simon's Kloof area. The results of the Perception Survey will inform a potential CID Business Plan which must be supported by not less than 60% of the property owners in the CID area and approved by the City of Cape Town.

Should the CID establishment application be successful and be approved by Council, the Simon's Kloof CID Steering Committee will establish a Non-Profit Company ("NPC") in terms of the Companies Act 71 of 2008. Once the NPC is registered, property owners will have the opportunity to apply for membership thereof. A public Members' Meeting will be held within 6 months from the establishment of the NPC to elect directors, appoint an auditor and approve the following financial year's Budget and Implementation Plan

The CID establishment application can only be submitted to the City after a vote, with not less than 60% of rateable property owners within the CID area agreement is obtained.

Your participation and support in developing this potential CID, will not only be greatly appreciated but also lead to upgrading of the public urban environment around your property.

The personal information provided in the survey will be kept confidential and only be used for the purpose of investigating and establishing the potential Simon's Kloof CID.

WHAT IS A CID?

The term CID refers to a specific geographical area approved by the Council of the City of Cape Town (under the Special Rating Area By-Law, 2012) in which top-up municipal services are provided in addition to those rendered by the City, including public safety and security cleansing, urban and environmental management, social development, and communication.

The CID operates via a statutory Non-Profit Company (NPC) funded by CID additional property rates (attracting VAT) and collected by the City of Cape Town. The CID additional property rate is based on the municipal valuation of each property and payable by all property owners within the CID boundary. Property owners that receive a full or partial rebate on their rates will be exempt from paying the CID additional property rates. The CID additional property rate for the Simon's Kloof CID would replace the annual SKNW and FEGF contributions from residents.

The City pays the CID 1/12th of the CID's approved budget monthly and retains a 3% provision for bad debt. The CID NPC is managed by the elected Board of Directors who provides financial and functional oversight and strategic direction and operates according to the approved CID Business Plan.

MEMBERSHIP

Membership is open to all registered property owners in the CID area who are encouraged to apply for membership (at no cost) to exercise their rights to influence the business of the CID. The CID is accountable to its members and annually reports on its management and finances at the Annual General Meeting (which all registered property owners are entitled to attend).

WHY A CID?

The CID aims to:

- reduce crime, grime, and homelessness through improved management of the area.
- provide a safer and cleaner public environment.
- upgrade public spaces and thus tend to increase property values.

HOW DOES IT WORK?

- 'Top up' services will be added to those provided by the City.
- The additional rate may only be used for services in the designated area as outlined in the agreed business plan.
- A CID provides property owners with a direct say in the management of the designated area.
- The Simon's Kloof CID would replace the need to collect SKNW and FEGF contributions from our residents.

Research methodology:

The process set out in Chapter 1 of the SRA By-law requires that as part of the initiation phase, the steering committee conducts an **Urban Management Survey** (**UMS**). The purpose of the UMS is to gather feedback from property owners and people working or visiting the area on issues such as public safety and security, cleansing and social issues. This feedback is then analysed to help decide whether a CID is necessary and will meet the needs identified by the survey.

The purpose of the UMS is to inform the Business Plan, and as such needs to give context and insight into the proposed focus areas of the business plan. We designed the questionnaire to be specific to the proposed area and to evaluate and give insight into public perceptions about the four focus areas listed above. The survey was not intended to provide quantitative statistics but rather indicative trends upon which the needs in the area can be evaluated.

We opted to use an online questionnaire tool (Survey Monkey) for survey answer collection, for the following reasons:

- To make the process of answering the questionnaire as easy and quick as possible for respondents, so as to achieve a higher conversion (answer) rate
- To save time and reduce errors that might happen if we had to manually collate results

Survey was created using Survey Monkey and sent to COCT database of Simon's Kloof property owners.

One submission per household

One submission per multiple properties owned.

Several automated reminders sent to recipients prior to closure date.

Simon's Kloof Boundary Map as Identified for CID

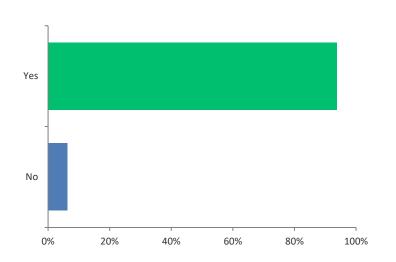

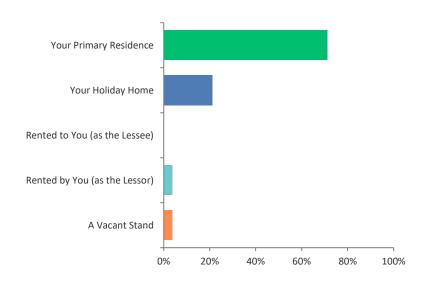

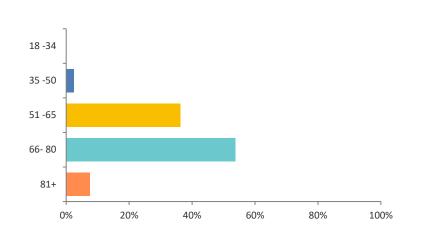

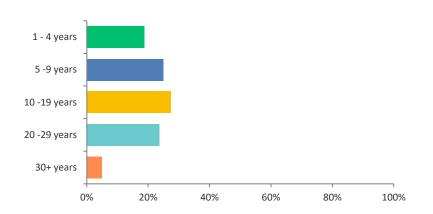

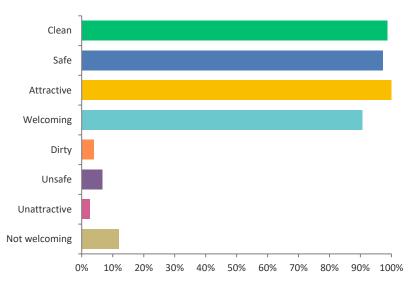

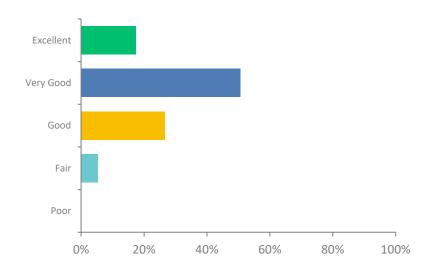

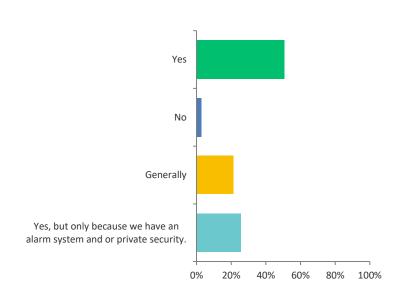

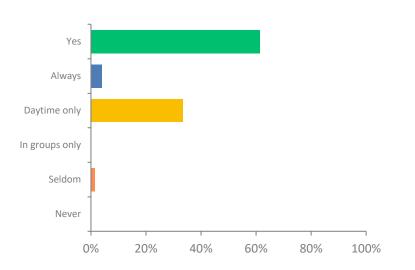

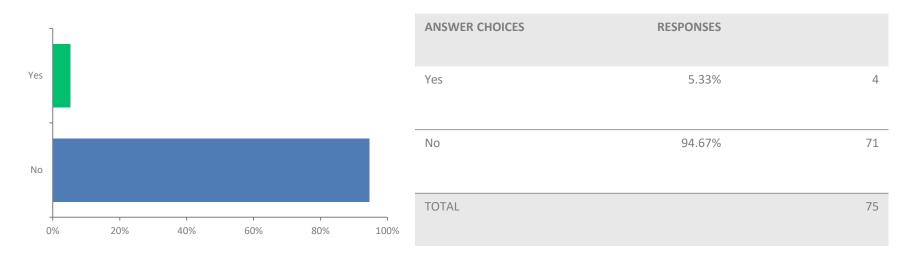

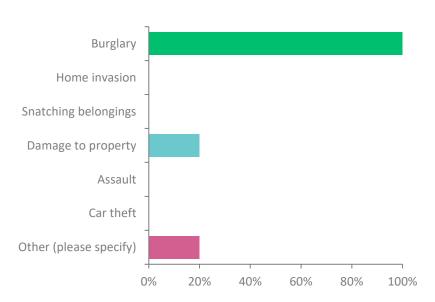

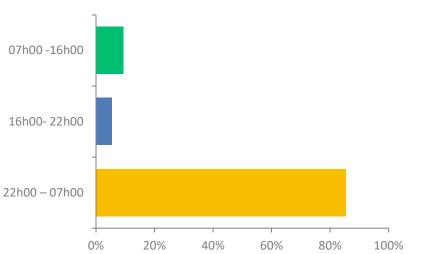

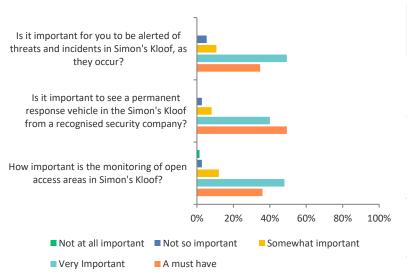

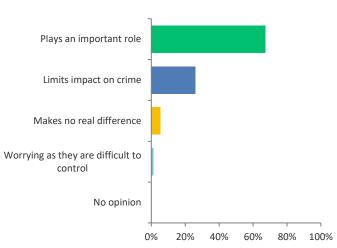

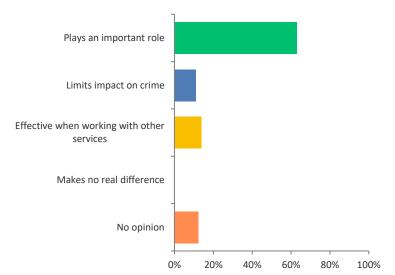

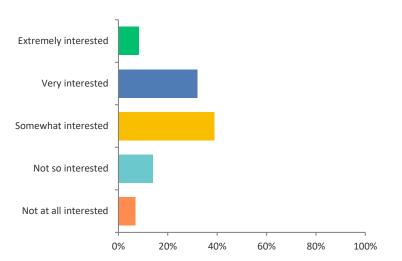

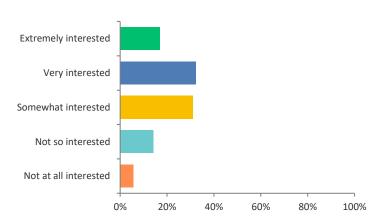

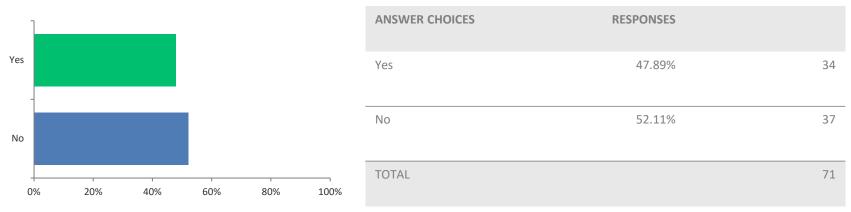

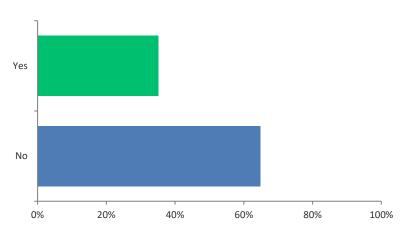

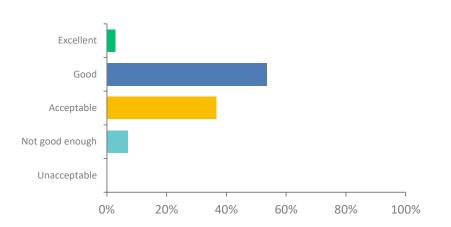

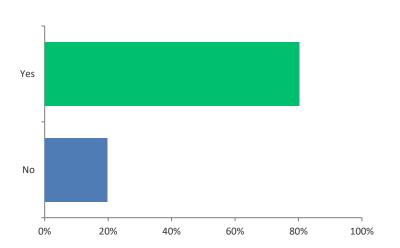

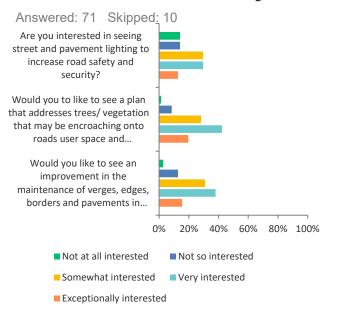

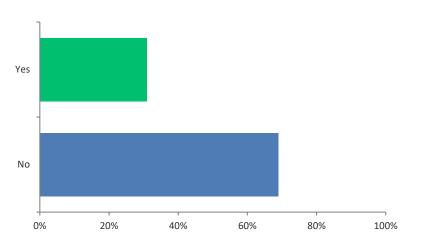

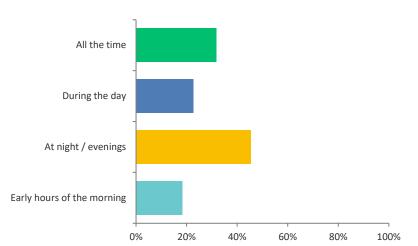

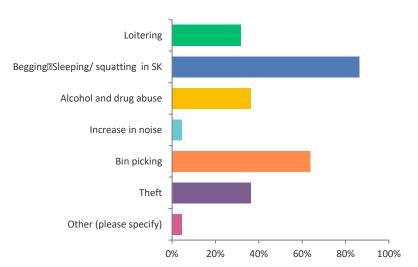

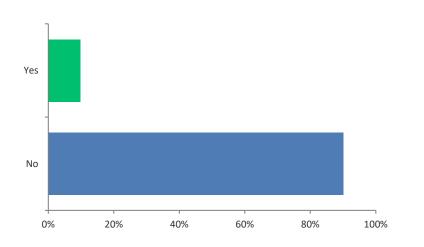

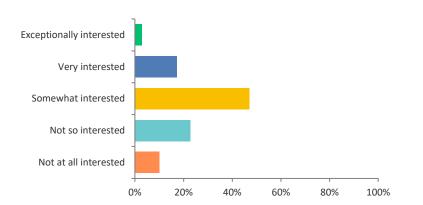

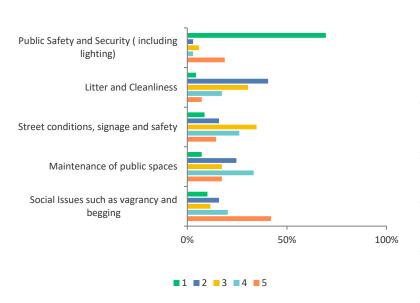

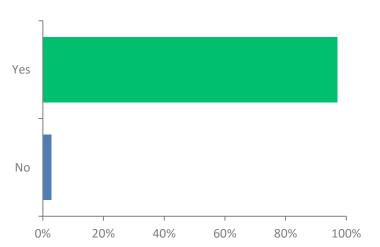

Nico Panagiotopoulos (NP) opened the meeting @ 6:05pm by welcoming and thanking residents and guests for attending the meeting. He then went through the SK CID presentation which included:

- Introduction
- The Steering Committee

- Why a CID in Simon's Kloof?
- The Proposed Geographic Area
- The Urban Management Survey Results
- The Business Plan Objectives

 - Urban Management Initiatives including Fire Management
 - o Communications
- Proposed Budget & Financial Implications
- Way Forward
- Consent / Objection Process

NP asked that questions and comments be left until the end of the presentation, and which he opened the floor.

Joepie Joubert from the City of Cape Town introduced their role as facilitators of the entire CID process from concept to approval which includes but not limited to;

- Validation of Steering Committee Members
- CID Boundary confirmation
- Arrears Profile
- Reviews and edits SK CID prepared document submissions;
 - ✓ Public Participation Plan
 - ✓ Urban Management Survey (Perception Survey)
 - ✓ Business Plan (Draft)
 - ✓ Budget (Draft)
 - √ 1st & 2nd Public Meeting Presentations
 - ✓ Final CID Application Submission.

Questions raised from the floor:

1. Why isn't St Barts included in the geographical area?

As Saint Barts is a new development in which not all the properties are sold, we have no way of engaging with the owners at this stage. Once the full development is sold, a process to apply to extend the geographically of the CID could be initiated by either party, however this requires completely new CID application process We currently provide no SKNW services to this development.

2. Who runs the whole thing once the CID gets going?

The Steering Committee runs it for now, however once the approval has been granted by the Council, they will become the Founding Directors of the NPO. All residents within the CID may become members of the NPO and they then elect a Board of Directors within 6 months of NPO incorporation that will be in place for a 1-year period and replaced annually at the AGM.

3. You mentioned that Imini will no longer be providing services?

Any services provided to the CID are required to have competitive tendering process. Currently Imini/ISS provide SK with 365 days x 12 hours dedicated patrol vehicle on the basis that and agreed % of residents are contractual clients to Imini/ISS for their home security.

The Steering Committee cannot prescribe which security company should provide alarm response monitoring to the individual households.

4. There is no budget to drive for volunteers in the Business Plan?

Yes, that is correct. We will be hiring contractual resources to do specific functions and that is included in the budget. Recommendations from residents as to how we could improve this were encouraged.

5. How does one volunteer?

Let the committee know you are interested and what skills you have. We are at this stage looking for accounting / finance skills and residents who have good organisational skills and / or are skilled at managing supplier relationships.

6. Does this mean that we need to involve and pay for auditors?

Yes, if/when the CID is approved then we need to engage auditing services. This has been accounted for in the SK CID budget.

7. Is VAT payable?

Yes, and is recoverable.

8. Will the current service / system (SKNW & FEGF) go ahead until the new CID comes into place?

Yes, it will. All current SKNW and FEGF services and objectives continue, as does the associated annual contributions from residents. The two committee have joined into one to assist with administration, decision making and contribution collection. You will be receiving a communication on the annual contribution required by the end of the week.

Necessity to physically operate the SKNW remains to ensure ongoing communications & operations with adjoining NHW's

9. Does the current committee stay in place and are annual contributions due for 23/24?

Yes, the current committee continue to serve in their current capacity, and we will be communicating the 23/24 contribution shortly.

10.If you are not in favour of the CID, what is the process?

Please submit any comments, questions, suggestions you may have in writing to simonskloofcid@gmail.com by 9 November 2023. Thereafter you will be required to indicate your objection to the proposed CID in the voting process. However, feedback is encouraged to allow us to potentially modify the business plan to accommodate relevant concerns and bring more residents on board.

11.Even if some elect No, and everybody else wants the CID, will everybody need to contribute?

Yes, this is a consent process, if 60% or more vote in favour of the CID, everyone in the geographical area will be accountable to pay the rate levied.

12. Who manages the non-payers?

The City of Cape Town through their current practices and processes.

Do all the funds come back to the SKCID from the City?

Every rand that is paid toward the CID, comes back to the NPO. Except for 3% which is held by the City as bad debt provision. The City then refunds us 75% of the bad debt provision.

14. How long will it take for the City to start billing residents?

If the CID proposal is accepted by 60% of the property owners, approved by the City and all business requirements required by the City are in place, the City would commence billing property owners on 1st July 2024.

15. One property = one vote, 2 properties = 2 votes?

You have one vote for each erf owned.

16. What happens with the Abstentions?

Abstentions are treated as a No.

17. How does the voting process take place?

After the 2nd Public Meeting, in which the revised business plan and budget is presented, the Voting process commences. It is a formal process in which a signed form from each property is required either physically or online. If the property is in the name of a business or trust, additional documentation (resolutions, trust documents etc) will need to be submitted with the Voting form. Details of the requirements will be provided by the City.

Please note that an unsigned form equals a no vote, as does an untraceable property owner.

17. Could we email our comments/ questions directly to the City Representatives?

No, unfortunately not. All of the SK residents feedback, comments and or suggestions must be submitted in writing to simonskloofcid@gmail.com by 9 November 2023. This is required to then be collated and submitted to the City. Then together the City and SK CID Steering Committee will address each concern or questions.

Comments:

- 1. A resident stated that on a positive note that the Industrial area near the Airport, had entered a CID about 35 years ago, and it now most likely the best and safest Industrial area in the Western Cape.
- 2. Joepie Joubert mentioned that once the CID is established, our Ward Counsellor would sit on the Board as an observer, however he / she will have no voting rights.
- 3. MdP advised that she had investigated and made contact with other similar sized CID's to obtain insight and learnings, which was extremely useful.
- 4. A resident stated his concern that should this CID not be approved; we could form part of a bigger CID whose priorities are not in line with ours and this would have a negative impact. Essentially it means that should the SK CID go through, we as a

- community decide on the priorities set. The purpose of the Urban Management (Perception Survey) was to identify such priorities.
- 5. MdP and GD, requested the help of the community in spreading the word, and become proactive motivators in sharing the CID objectives, but also in assisting the committee in obtaining updated contact details and emails where possible.

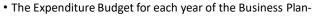

Who will manage the CID?

- The SC is responsible for finalising the CID application if >60% of property owners mandate them to do so.
- If the application is successful, the SC will register a non-profit company (NPC) to run
 the CID. By default, the SC will be listed as founding Directors when the NPC is
 registered at CIPC.
- Within 6 months of registration of the NPC, a members' meeting must be held where nominations can be tabled for the election of a new board of directors. A City appointee will have an Observer role.
- An NPC has 'members' instead of shareholders. Any property owner liable for additional rates can register to be a member of the NPC. Members can vote at AGM's, including appointing Directors and approving budgets.
- The Board will appoint a contract Administrator to run day-to-day operations.

Nico Panagiotopoulos (NP) opened the meeting @ 6:05pm by welcoming and thanking residents and guests from the CoCT for attending the meeting. He then went through the SK CID presentation which included:

- Consent / Objection Process explained

NP stated that questions could be asked during the presentation, and hence the following questions were raised from the floor:

1. If the Property is owned by more than one person, do you need both parties to sign?

Regarding signing the forms, there are two types of Persons that own property — the one being a Natural Person/s. In this case each natural owner will need to check their detail and sign the Consent-Objection form. The second type is that of a Juristic Person (which includes business, trust etc). In this instance the form would need to completed by the authorised representatives and depending on the type of entity, additional documents will need to be submitted. Please refer to the document requirements on the form.

2. With the Consent – Objection process closing on the 16th December, who in the City will be managing the vetting process during The Festive Season?

The City team is back in office during the first week of January, and they have stated that it will take them a day to vet the consent – objection forms. They have the resources available to deal with the SKCID and others. The City have also confirmed that the Business plan has already been circulated to the relevant Directors within the City.

3. Who runs the whole thing once the CID gets going?

The Steering Committee runs it for now, however once the approval has been granted by the Council, they will become the Founding Directors of the NPO. All residents within the CID may become members of the NPO and they then elect a Board of Directors within 6 months of NPO incorporation that will be in place for a 1-year period and replaced annually at the AGM.

4. Should the Board of Directors, have to change annually, this could be difficult due to delays on CIPC and for banking etc.

With regard to changing of Directors, the current committee become the initial board. At the AGM one third must resign, however they can make themselves immediately available to be stand again. The members then may nominate new board members who would need to be voted in.

The City assists in both pre and post establishments processes and this includes tax registration.

5. If people complete the form and consent to the CID, however the form is not fully completed, will it get rejected and or treated as an abstention.

The Steering Committee member acting as your street representative, will do an initial screening of your form, and may contact you for additional information or documentation. Once submitted to the City, they look at the intent of the form i.e., ID the individual/ body objecting or consenting.

As the committee need to check each and every form for completeness and the submission of documents (where needed), they have requested that you complete and submit the form as quickly as possible.

6. Is there a full detailed document that I can go through to understand the rationale, strategy, business plan etc, as it is hard to assimilate this in a 1-hour presentation? You can find a Consolidated document on the website www.simonskloofcid.co.za which includes the Business Plan, Implementation Plan, Budget, Public Participation Plan, Perception Survey template and results and comments from residents regarding the business plan. You may contact any of the Steering Committee should you need any assistance in this regard.

Comments:

- 1. A resident stated that she remembered the time when there was a security incident every 3 days, and that we in Simon's Kloof have now become comfortable with no crime, and think we may not need this, but we do.
- 2. MdP referred to her conversation with the Manager of the Overkloof CID in Hout Bay, who started from a high crime basis. The Overkloof CID is similar size CID to ours. Points raised in various CID's highlight that it is critical to ensure that you are not surrounded by other CID's as the crime then moves into non CID areas. Other points raised advised that if you form part of a larger CID, your areas unique needs and priorities may get lost and the budget spent on your specific focus area may be reduced.
- 3. MdP advised that all information & documents relating to the Consent Objections forms are treated as confidential by the CID Steering Committee and the City of Cape Town.

NP thanked all for attending and closed the SK CID meeting @ 7: 00pm by reminding residents to complete, sign and submit their Consent – Objection forms ASAP.

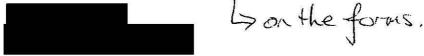
